


Course/Academic Advising:

what is it?



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
• Academic advising is the process of *helping* students *plan* and *achieve* their *academic goals*

• Course advisers provide guidance on course selection, degree requirements, and academic policies

Support

 Course advisers are also responsible for providing student support.

 They offer guidance on personal and academic issues, connect students to opportunities, and help them navigate the university system.



Mentorship



Course Advisers empower students to reach their fullest potential by providing *mentorship* and *assistance* throughout their stay in the University

Advisors ask What, Why, and How Questions

- How are you changing as a result of your education?
- What are your goals for your education?
- How can you make the most of your time in the University?
- What skills are you developing? What skills do you need to develop, and how will you do this?





- excel in their career.



Meet with students regularly, at least twice in a semester


